We haven't seen any Muskies in the bays here on the island as yet...it may be too cold for them as yet.

Guests have reported bear sightings as well as beaver and deer. Bob spotted a nice size deer up on the drain field so we know they are still on the island. It wasn't the 13 point buck we saw here last Fall. Our loon nesting platform is out and the pair is busy making their nest.

The weather is suppose to warm up in the next few days which will be most welcome as our guests start coming in just a few days.
